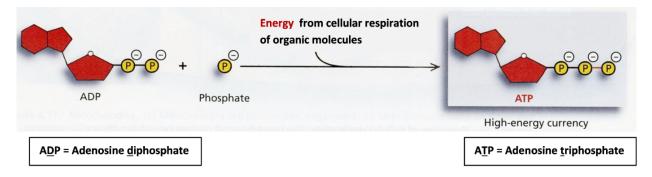
How do biological organisms use energy?¹

The Importance of ATP

Living organisms use a <u>two-step process</u> to provide the energy needed for most of their biological activities.

I. First, <u>chemical energy from the breakdown of sugars or other organic molecules is used to</u> make ATP molecules. This process is called cellular respiration.



II. Then, <u>ATP provides the energy for most biological processes</u>. When ATP breaks down to ADP plus a phosphate (P), this releases energy which is used for many different cellular processes.

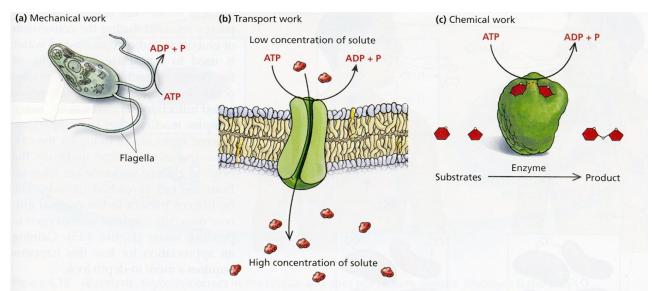
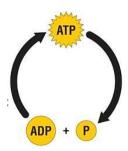


Figure 4.12 ATP and cellular work. ATP powers (a) mechanical work, such as the moving of the flagella of this single-celled green algae, Chlamydomonas; (b) transport work, such as the active transport of a substance across a membrane from its own low to high concentration; and (c) chemical work, such as the enzymatic conversion of substrates to a product.

Notice that the role of <u>ATP</u> in biological organisms is somewhat similar to the role of <u>money</u> in our society. Most people use a two-step process to get food, clothing, etc.

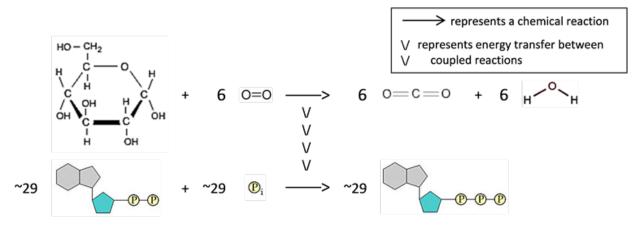
1. Inside each cell, ATP is constantly breaking down to ADP plus P and ATP is constantly being made from ADP plus P. Add to this diagram to show how the breakdown of ATP is useful and how cellular respiration contributes to the production of ATP. Explain why a cell needs to constantly break down ATP and make ATP.



2. Explain why the reaction, ADP + P \rightarrow ATP, requires energy input. (Hint: Review the top figure on the previous page and remember that like charges repel each other.)

I. Cellular Respiration

During <u>cellular respiration</u> the breakdown of organic molecules such as sugars or fats provides the energy to make ATP molecules. The chemical equations shown below summarize cellular respiration of glucose (a simple sugar). The actual process of cellular respiration in cells requires many steps which are not shown here. Current research indicates that about 29 ATP are made during cellular respiration. Before this research the commonly accepted number was 36.



3. Write the names of each of the molecules in these chemical equations.

3b. Notice that the atoms in the $C_6H_{12}O_6$ and O_2 molecules are reorganized as atoms in the CO_2 and O_2 molecules. Although the atoms stay the same, $C_6H_{12}O_6$ (the sugar glucose) has multiple C-C and C-H bonds which have more stored chemical energy than the C=O and O-H bonds in CO_2 and O_2 . In the first chemical equation, use an asterisk to mark each higher energy C-C and C-H bond, and circle each lower energy C=O and O-H bond.

$$C_6 H_{12}O_6 + 6 O_2 \longrightarrow 6 CO_2 + 6 H_2O + ATP$$

What is wrong with this equation? (Hint: Think about where the atoms in an ATP molecule come from.)

II. Using ATP to Provide Energy for Biological Processes

The energy released by the breakdown of ATP to ADP plus P is used for many biological processes, including synthesizing molecules, pumping ions into or out of the cell, and muscle contraction.

Explain your reasoning to choose the correct answer.

Two important general principles about energy are:

- Energy can be transformed from one type to another (e.g. the stored chemical energy in ATP can be transformed to the kinetic energy of muscle motion). However, <u>energy can not</u> be created or destroyed by biological processes.
- All types of energy conversion are <u>inefficient</u> and result in the production of <u>heat</u>. For
 example, when ATP provides the energy for muscle contraction, only about 20-25% of the
 chemical energy released from the ATP molecules is captured in the kinetic energy of
 muscle contraction. The rest of the energy from the ATP is converted to heat.
